Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, The month of February brings with it the evitable flurry of chocolates, flowers, and other gifts for Valentine’s day. It is during this time of the year that we begin to hear much discussion about love. While I don’t believe that there is anything wrong with celebrating Valentine’s day, it is unfortunate that all too often the love that is celebrated on Valentine’s day is not true love.

Often, in our society, we think of love as only a feeling, something ephemeral that can change from moment to moment. This kind of love is often dependent on physical characteristics or the way in which another person treats us. God’s Word paints a different picture of love. To be sure, we see examples of the wonderful feelings that can accompany love, in Song of Songs for example, but actual love itself is revealed to us as an action. Consider the following words about love from Holy Scripture:

“Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth” (1 John 3:18, ESV).

“Greater love has no one than this, that someone lays down his life for his friends” (John 15:13, ESV).

“And he [Jesus] answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." Luke 10:27 (ESV)

As you can clearly see, God does not command that we have a special kind of feeling toward Him or our family (though that certainly can be a part of love). He is commanding action. God does not desire His people to be people who only say the “right” things. God desires a people who show their love for Him by what they do. As the supreme example of this, God the Father showed us love when He acted to correct the problem of sin and gave His only Son, Jesus Christ, to die and rise in our place for the forgiveness of our sins. Now, through simple, God-created faith in Him, we have the remission of sins and eternal life. We are given the opportunity to bear witness to the love our God has shown us by loving those around us.

How can you show greater love this month?

“Missionary Hearts for our Community! What is a Missionary Heart?”

In Acts 17:16-23ff., Paul provides us with some clues on the kind of missionary thinking and strategy necessary when engaging a worldly (alien to Christ) culture. Let’s take a look at the passage first:

“While Paul was waiting for them in Athens, he was greatly distressed to see that the city was full of idols. So he reasoned in the synagogue with the Jews and the God-fearing Greeks, as well as in the marketplace day by day with those who happened to be there. A group of Epicurean and Stoic philosophers began to dispute with him. Some of them asked, ‘What is this babbler trying to say?’ ...Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said: ‘Men of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious. For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: TO AN UNKNOWN GOD. Now what you worship as something unknown I am going to proclaim to you.’”

As Paul walked the streets of Athens we are told that **his heart was greatly distressed**. The phrase **“greatly distressed” is a bit tame. The Greek actually indicates that Paul had a great pain in his chest** while he meandered the streets of this great pagan city. **Paul’s heart was broken when he saw the city full of idols because he knew the hopelessness of idol worship.** Paul knew that the spiritual roads that the Athenians had committed to were ultimately dead ends. What he took in with his eyes moved Paul emotionally and spiritually.

Engaging our communities must first start with our heart and the Spirit’s heart! If our hearts are not broken then we must ask God to break them by asking Him to show us the people in our community that He weeps for. Ask Him for the missionary eyes of the Apostle Paul, for eyes that see behind the “idols” which lead to dead ends. We must be careful not to rush ahead to missionary activities before we have asked the fundamental question about our own hearts. Living like a missionary is impossible if it is not rooted in the heart of the Gospel. God’s compassion for us creates the heart of compassion for others. So, as you walk our streets of our “Athens” know God will move our hearts for Jesus.

Missionary Eyes in Your Community – Walking the Pavement

From Acts 17, we get the impression that Paul was a learner and that he was wonderfully inquisitive. **He discovered unique characteristics of the city by walking the pavement. He read the inscriptions underneath the various idols he encountered throughout urban neighborhoods.** He watched carefully as commerce was conducted in the marketplace, and he engaged the “spiritually curious” in open discussion in the synagogues but also entering where unbelievers lived. Paul realized that being a student of a community would ultimately provide the keys he needed for reaching some with the Gospel. **We can picture Paul, walking, talking, and investigating the values and convictions of the people of Athens so that he could build a communication bridge for the Gospel. Ultimately, the Lord opened up a door for Paul among the men of the Areopagus.** He had done his homework though! **He had studied the culture and he had found a creative way to express the life-transforming message of Christianity.**

How well does our church understand the community that surrounds it? Do you know about your schools? Do you have friends putting activities for their kids before a relationship with Jesus? Do we know friends’ marriages are hurting or ended? Do you know the needs of single family or remarried? What do the police in your community see happening around you? **Where are the unmet needs? What are the voids in people’s lives?** What are the gods in our community? Do you desire to share who the “UNKNOWN GOD” is for them? We need to understand the pulse and vital signs of the community to have an opportunity to bridge and share the Gospel.

Having your “finger on the pulse” of your friends, neighbors, and community requires an on-going effort. Paul found the keys to the culture by being in the culture and by being out with the people of the city. Rather than staying only in the synagogue (sanctuary) or bemoaning the shifts in our culture we should be working actively to understand how and why the shifts are taking place. From this vantage point we will be able to build communication bridges for the Gospel. **Let us “walk the pavements” in order to understand the needs and hurts so that we will have won the right through caring and involvement to be heard like Paul to bring Christ to Athens.** *(Parts are from Transforming Churches Network ©2010 and edited 1/2012 by Pastor James Jobst by permission)*

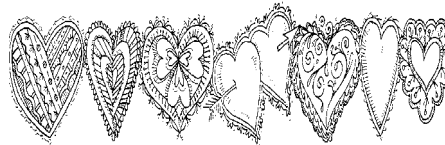
